**We hereby invite you to participate in the IV international conference "DIGITAL SOCIETY AS CULTURAL-HISTORICAL CONTEXT OF HUMAN DEVELOPMENT: FROM HOMO SAPIENCE TO HOMO ROBOTICUS".**

The conference will be held on **17-19 February 2022** at State University of Humanities and Social Studies

Conference purpose: create a common ground for professionals studying the impact of the new cultural context (digital society) on the development of the human personality, the exchange of experience of resolving social and economic educational issues which stem from this new cultural context, as well as to highlight the role of system approach to a wide range of topical issues in contemporary science, i.e.:

- multidisciplinary approach to the study of the impact that the new cultural context (rapid expansion of digital and hybrid reality) has on the people, and arising social, economic, educational and moral concerns.
- scientific justification of the risks and opportunities of using digital technologies for human development;
- scientific diplomacy, which is especially relevant, in the face of a sharp decline in the role of traditional diplomacy in the global community.

Accepted abstracts and paper will be published in conference proceedings, which will be assigned an ISBN and indexed in Russian Science Citation Index (full text version of the proceedings will be available an eLibrary.ru). (the cost of mailing the collection is 150 rubles (1.8 Euro), the cost of the additional proceedings volume is 250 rubles (3 Euro) ).

**Paper formatting guidelines:**

- Volume: up to 5 pages;
- MS Word-1998-2003 format (\*.doc file);
- Font: Times New Roman; Font Size 14, Line spacing: single, Margins size: all 2.5 cm
- First line indent - 1 cm.
- Article title: capitals, bold, center alignment;
- One line below: initials and surname of the author(s), bold italic, center alignment;
- Next line: country, city, institution (abbreviated), lowercase, center alignment;
- Contact details (e-mail) of the author;
- One line below: abstract, in Russian and in English (up to 300 characters, incl. whitespace), font size - 12;
- One line below: keywords in Russian and English (3-8 words), font size - 12;
- One line below - text of the article, alignment - justified;
- Do not include graphic objects;
- Do not apply styles,
- Do not use 'Lists' function and special options in the 'Format - Paragraph -- Line and Page Breaks';

- use only italics and bold for text emphasis. Do not use tracking or underlining;
- In-text references: the number of the publication listed in references in square brackets (example, [1]). No footnotes. Pages of the source cited are to be listed at all times (example, [3. 17]);
- References (10 maximum) appear two lines after the main text. Font size - 12. Title: **References**. Works in References are to be listed alphabetically with continuing numbering.
