CLASSES: The history of forensic sciences. The fundamental principles of forensic identification. Forensic evidence – definition, classifications. Human forensic identification – methods, current challenges. Identification of unknown human remains – DVI Guide standards, current practical challenges. Firearms forensics. Traceology. Mechanoscopy. Digital forensics. Crime scene examination. 3D scanning on a crime scene. Police interrogation and interview tactics.
