SUBJECT MATTER CONTENT

LECTURE

The contents of the course include the history of veterinary medicine as a profession and a science. The subject describes people's views on animal diseases and their treatment from ancient times to the present day. There are presented methods of combating infectious animal diseases, veterinary device production and their improvement, and the development of the veterinary professional literature. Much attention is paid to discuss the history of the development of veterinary education, both in the world and in Poland. There are discussed many issues, including organization of veterinary services for animal health care and its influence on animal treatment, forensic veterinary, military veterinary medicine, as well as the history of surveillance of animal products. The deontology is an integral part of the course, discussing the development of deontological codes and forming the right attitude at work, respecting the rules of professional ethics. The complement of the course is to present the history of the most important discoveries in biology and medicine.

TEACHING OBJECTIVE

The purpose of education is to familiarize students with the history of the veterinary profession, the changing tasks of the veterinary service. In addition, an important task is to teach future veterinarians act according to moral principles, in accordance with the deontology
