Substantive content

CLASSES/LECTURES: : Preliminary course in graphic design, where students get to know the relationship between form and meaning and learn to use it consciously. Students get to know the basic elements of graphic design and build graphic messages in response to specific tasks.

Learning purpose:

Students pursue a series of topics from composition exercises to building more complex messages, responding in an individual way to specific tasks. At the same time, they get acquainted with the basics of semantic theories (to the extent useful in design) and elements of the history of graphic design and learn to use consciously visual conventions (contemporary and historical).

On completion of the study programme the graduate will gain:

Knowledge:

Student has a general knowledge of basic developmental trends in the history of graphics and animation, their mutual relations and consequences. Student has knowledge of art styles throughout history, knows and is able to reach the necessary information (books, recordings, scientific materials)

Skills:

Student has the ability to solve basic design problems and the ability to formulate, differentiate and edit artistic expression using appropriate tools and technologies

Student is able to independently improve the workshop by searching for and comparing effects resulting from the use of different tools.
