Substantive content

CLASSES: The course Sculpture with Ceramics item includes two pieces of art: sculpture and ceramics.

During the 4th semester, students perform exercises related to ceramic techniques.

These exercises in relation to the general character are creative, because they involve the design of ceramic forms,

character or utility properties.

During the implementation of their student projects, they gain knowledge about ceramics-related technology.

Students learn turning on a potter's wheel, making plaster casts, glazing ceramic molds, etc.

Learning purpose:

Deepening the knowledge and skills of using ceramic techniques.
