#### Substantive content

CLASSES: The course Sculpture item includes two pieces of art: sculpture and ceramics.

The exercises conducted in this practice are of study and creation nature.

During the 3rd semester, students perform study exercises in the form of a group: head study, hand study.

Some tasks are more creative and involve designing and making sculptures in various materials, as well as designing small reliefs and medals.

All exercises are accompanied by acquired knowledge about exercises during technology work.

Students learn to construct scaffolding for sculptures, use plaster casts for their work.

## Learning purpose: :

Deepening the knowledge and skills related to study, literary and foundry workshops.

# On completion of the study programme the graduate will gain:

### Knowledge:

- W1 Has general knowledge about the anatomy and proportions of the human skull and head.
- W2 Has general knowledge about the implementation of works in the technique of small carved, sculptural forms.
- W3 Acquainted with the recommended literature on the subject.

- U2 Can design a small medallion form independently. Can analyze and synthesize sculptural form. He mastered the method of carving small sculptural forms in plaster.
