Substantive content

CLASSES: The grammar topics covered in class include: present tenses, past tenses, future tenses, passive voice, causative have, conditional sentences, articles, noun clauses, adjectives, relative clauses, inversion, fronting, reported speech, verb complementation, etc.

Learning purpose: Students will acquire knowledge about complex English grammatical structures (exercises/theory) and they will become acquainted with the terminology required for the description of various grammatical structures in the English language.

Skills: Students will reach level C1/C2 (grammar skills) in accordance with the Common European Framework of Reference for Languages.

Social Competencies: Students will be able to communicate fluently in the English language in an English-speaking environment and in the English foreign language classroom by using correct advanced/proficient grammatical constructions.
