Substantive content

CLASSES: Nouns (gender, countable and uncountable, group and collective), adjectives (comparatives and superlatives, intensifying and weakening expressions), adverbs (form and use), verbs: grammatical tenses, passives, causative forms, conditionals (present, future, hypothetical), unreal past, reported speech in affirmatives, negatives and questions, reporting with and without backshift, modal auxiliaries: modals of ability, possibility, obligation and certainty, prepositions, verb patterns (infinitive, gerund, that-clause), clauses, sentence synthesis, conjunctions

Learning purpose: to gain advanced grammatical skills, both in terms of passive and active competence

Knowledge: thorough and systematic knowledge of the English grammatical system

Skills: advanced active competence in terms of using a variety of grammatical structures
