Substantive content

CLASSES: Students have the opportunity to learn the working conditions of a radio journalist in practice. They prepare radio materials, collect voices and sounds in the city and practice reading and recording in the radio studio. They edit what they recorded using editing software. One of the important elements of classes is also broadcasting the best materials in radio stations. The topic of the radio recording is chosen in the group every year to make it as interesting and up to date as possible.
