CLASSES: none

LECTURES: Lecture topics are based on the content of "Lumen Gentium": the mystery of the Church, the people of God, the hierarchical structure of the Church, the laity, the universal call to holiness, religious, the eschatological nature of the pilgrim Church, the Blessed Virgin Mary, the Saints. There is also attention to the sacraments of the Church and to the saints the sacraments of the Church. These matters are included into the context of the pluralism of disciplines, the development of communication systems and the cultural diversity in many parts of the world.

Learning purpose: Understanding the sense of the Church's presence in the world in changing evangelization conditions
